DENTAL ASSISTING PROGRAM INFORMATION PACKET

GENERAL CAREER INFORMATION:

The **Dental Assistant** is a valuable member of the dental team offering a wide variety of clinical skills and knowledge to assist the dentist with the everyday operations of the dental office. The dental assistant commonly performs various tasks in the dental office such as assisting the dentist chair side with restorative or surgical procedures, providing oral evacuation during dental procedures, transferring instruments, mixing dental materials, exposing radiographs as directed by the dentist, taking or preparing materials for impressions, sterilization of instruments, obtaining and/or updating patient dental records, taking and recording vital signs, preparing operatories for dental treatment, and providing postoperative/general oral healthcare instructions. Other duties may also include, removing sutures, placing topical anesthetics, isolating teeth with the use of a dental dam, removal of excess cement, and applying occlusal sealants.

PROGRAM ACCREDITATION:

The Dental Assisting and Dental Hygiene programs offered by Athens Technical College are accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation and have been granted the accreditation status of "approval without reporting requirements." The Commission is a specialized accrediting body recognized by the United States Department of Education. PROGRAM ADMISSIONS INFORMATION:

The Dental Assisting program can accept fifteen (15) students in the Summer term. Students not selected are encouraged to apply to the program for the following year. Students should receive advising and academic counseling from the dental program faculty regarding their status and academic planning.

Selection to the program will be weighted toward students who have completed all core classes prior to enrolling in Dental Assisting (DENA) classes; however, students must complete pre-requisite MAST 1060) prior to acceptance to be considered for competitive admission.

While not mandatory, students can attend a group pre-admission information session prior to acceptance. Curriculum, schedules, and all pertinent information about the program will be discussed as well as an open question and answer opportunity for students.

The Dental Assisting program is a rigorous, full-time program that requires commitment and hard work. All dental courses require at least a grade of "C" for successful completion and continuation in the program. For a portion of the laboratory learning experiences, it is necessary for students to practice on each other. If for any medical, dental, or personal reason a student is unable to participate, it will be the student's responsibility to provide a patient for each of those sessions. In addition, students will be required to provide their own transportation to external site rotations (off campus) for assigned practicum experience during the Fall and Spring semesters.

Students enrolled in the Dental Assisting Program are at risk for exposure to blood and body fluids, and the potential does exist for transmission of blood-borne and other infectious diseases during patient care activities. Each applicant may view the Dental Assisting Program Policies on Bloodborne and Infectious Diseases upon request; this document is also available at the Dental Assisting Program orientation. The Dental Assisting faculty will discuss or answer any questions that an applicant may have concerning these policies.

APPLICATION DUE DATES:

The Dental Assisting program *begins* in the <u>Summer Semester</u>. Applications should be submitted online by **11:59 p.m.** (E.S.T.) on March 1 of the year they seek admission to the program, to be considered for Summer enrollment. Students who enroll in the Summer term can expect to complete the program in as little as 12 months.

CERTIFICATION/CREDENTIALS/EMPLOYMENT:

Graduates of the Dental Assisting program will receive a Dental Assisting Diploma, Radiology/EDDA Certificate TCC, and a Coronal Polishing TCC in Dental Assisting from Athens Technical College, which legally permits the student to expose oral radiographic images and perform expanded duties as allowed by the State of Georgia. Expanded duties are advanced intraoral tasks delegated by a dentist to a formally trained dental assistant who has demonstrated clinical competency. Graduates of the Dental Assisting program are eligible and encouraged to take the Dental Assisting National Board (DANB) examination earning the Certified Dental Assistant (CDA) credential which is commonly required for employment.

Regional employment opportunities vary depending on location and demand; consult with Dental program faculty for additional information regarding employment and compensation for our service area.

CRIMINAL BACKGROUND CHECKS/DRUG TESTING

Athens Technical College students who are granted acceptance into the Dental Assisting program must receive a satisfactory criminal background check prior to clinical rotation. The background check will be scheduled and performed at the discretion of the Division to which the student has applied. Information and instructions on how to complete the background check will be sent by the applicable program instructor. **Student applicants DO NOT complete background checks until directed to when accepted into the Dental Assisting program.**

DENTAL ASSISTING PROGRAM ADMISSIONS CHECKLIST

<u>IMPORTANT:</u> All items must be received and posted to the student's computer record prior to the published application deadline or the application will be considered incomplete.

THE DENTAL ASSISTING PROGRAM APPLICANT (STUDENT) MUST COMPLETE/SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING:
Apply for general admission to Athens Technical College (IF NOT CURRENTLY ENROLLED) Students MUST be in good academic standing. They cannot be on academic probation. Students must have a GPA of 2.0 to 4.0. Primary consideration for the program is given to Georgia residents. In the event that program slots cannot be filled with Georgia residents, out of state students can be admitted.
Provide Official High School Transcripts (or equivalent) to the Admissions office. An official transcript is a transcript that is sent directly from the granting school/institution to Athens Technical College Admissions. Transcripts that have been in the student's possession (regardless of whether they are "sealed," stamped, or in a sealed envelope) are not considered official and will not be accepted.
Provide all Official College/University Transcripts to the Admissions Office for evaluation. Official transcripts must be submitted from ALL post-secondary educational colleges or universities attended and must display all periods of enrollment and/or degrees earned. The applicant is responsible for ensuring that all college transcripts are evaluated prior to the application deadline. Candidates will receive ranking points based on the cumulative GPA of all post-secondary coursework and general education requirements.
Submit a current intent form on the ATC website to the Dental Assisting Program.
*Students denied from the Dental Hygiene program may be considered for this program. If they have not completed MAST 1060, they will only be considered if there are not enough applicants that have completed all requirements of the program.
