Veterinary Technology (VT23)	Georgia		Upon program completion, graduates must pass the Veterinary Technician National Examination (VTNE) and then apply for licensure in Georgia. VTs must be licensed in the state of Georgia if they are to be employed as a Veterinary Technician. Every state and province in the USA and Canada has a veterinary regulatory board tasked with regulating the practice of veterinary medicine. The American Association of Veterinary State Boards (AAVSB) provides a list of jurisdictions with links & contact information for the licensing board for Veterinary Technicians (in jurisdictions that require a license for Veterinary Technicians).
