



Dear Dental Hygiene Program Applicant:

The faculty members of the Dental Hygiene program at Athens Technical College (ATC) are pleased you have expressed interest in pursuing the Associate of Applied Science degree in Dental Hygiene!

Enclosed you will find an application checklist and some general information about the program. What you specifically will need to submit by the **January 10th** deadline depends upon your student status at ATC (see the “Dental Hygiene Program Application Checklist” included in this packet).

The Dental Hygiene Program will conduct three (3) virtual information sessions per calendar year. (July, October, December dates to be determined in April of each year) Documented attendance is **required** by all Dental Hygiene program applicants. Applicants must attend one of the virtual information sessions prior to the January 10th deadline of the year that application is being submitted. Attendance to a mandatory information session for a previous year’s application does **NOT** carry over to the next year’s application process.

Official transcripts (must be sent directly to Athens Technical College from the institution at which you earned course credit) and TEAS-V scores (must be sent directly to Athens Technical College by the test administrator).

All transcripts from colleges you attended previously must be official and it is your responsibility to request that they be sent to Athens Technical College such that they will arrive well before the application deadline. Once you have been accepted into the college, The Director of Registration and Records will evaluate your transcripts to determine if credit will be granted for previous coursework and will inform you by letter or ATC student email address of the credit awarded for previous college-level study. Applicants transferring from other colleges must have official transcripts sent directly to the ATC Office of Admissions. It is the student’s responsibility to confirm transferability of equivalent coursework with the ATC Director of Registration and Records before the January 10th application deadline.

Students who seek financial aid to help fund their college education should contact the Athens Technical College Financial Aid Office at (706) 583-5009 to speak to a financial aid counselor.

In 2012, Mrs. Young graduated with an Associate of Applied Science in Dental Hygiene from Athens Technical College earning the title of Registered Dental Hygienist. Mrs. Young is also a Certified Dental Assistant and has extensive knowledge in all aspects of dentistry. Prior to becoming a member of the Athens Tech Dental Programs team in 2019, Mrs. Young worked as a Registered Dental Hygienist and gained expertise in the area of patient oral health care. Mrs. Young is passionate about teaching students all aspects of tooth anatomy and firmly believes in Athens Technical College's mission of producing work ready students. Mrs. Young is a wife, mother to three children, and very involved in Cub Scouts. Mrs. Young and her family reside in Barrow County with 2 dogs and 2 hermit crabs.



Kell Hall is an instructor with the Dental Hygiene Program. Kelly Hall received her Bachelor's degree in Dental Hygiene from Georgia Highlands College. She received her Associate of Applied Science in Dental Hygiene from Lanier Technical College. Ms. Hall is a Certified Dental Assistant, a Registered Dental Hygienist and is Certified in Local Anesthesia. Ms. Hall worked as a clinical dental hygienist in private practice for 7 years and has been a member of the full-time faculty at Athens Technical College since 2022. Ms. Hall has extensive expertise in the area of clinical dental hygiene and is passionate about the profession. She is originally from Corpus Christi, TX and has lived in Georgia for over 25 years. Ms. Hall enjoys hanging out with her daughter, Kimberly, her dog Bachi, and loves anything outdoors!

Application Process:

The Dental Hygiene program cannot admit all qualified applicants. Program enrollment is limited to 18 students. Only students meeting the minimum requirements will be presented to the admissions committee. Final selection will be made by the admission committee and the 18 applicants with the highest total score will be admitted to the program. Candidates will be scored using selection points in the following courses, Mathematical Modeling (MATH 1101) or College Algebra (MATH 1111), Survey of Inorganic Chemistry w/lab (CHEM 1151/CHEM 1151L) or Chemistry I w/lab (CHEM 1211/CHEM 1211L), Anatomy and Physiology I and II w/lab (BIOL 2113/BIOL 2113L, BIOL 2114/BIOL 2114L), Introductory Microbiology w/lab (BIOL 2117/BIOL 2117L); and ATI TEAS score (see the “Dental Hygiene Program Application Checklist” included in this packet). If a course has been repeated, only the highest attempt will be calculated in the students science GPA.

Length of the Program:

After the pre-application courses have been successfully completed and a student has been accepted into the program, the curriculum can be completed in five consecutive semesters. Most students complete most if not all of the general education courses prior to enrolling in program-specific courses. Program-specific courses are taught in a strict sequence that begins each fall. Students are awarded an Associate of Applied Science degree upon program completion.

Academic Rigor:

Each course in the curriculum is offered only once per year in a very strict course sequence. Even when students have completed most or all of the general education courses in the curriculum, many students find that to be successful in the program academically they must make a full-time commitment to the program. Students are expected to be ACTIVE participants in the learning process. Successful completion requires dedicated, hard-working students who can conduct themselves in a professional manner during the learning process.

General Program Information:

The program combines general liberal arts courses with science and technical courses to prepare students to be employed as Dental Hygienists in a variety of settings. During the duration of the program, didactic and laboratory instructions are used to form a foundation upon which students can rely during the clinical phase of the program.

Hands-On and Clinical Experience:

In the ATC Dental Hygiene Program, initial training often utilizes models and alternative learning methods to allow students the opportunity to become proficient in technical skills prior to performing those skills in the clinical setting. The program schedules learning laboratories in which students can fine-tune their skills. Clinical sessions are performed on campus in the Dental Clinic along with rotations with three externships in the Athens area.

Clinical education plays a very significant role in your development as a professional Dental Hygienist. Attendance in clinical rotations is not optional. This means that you will need to plan carefully to avoid clinical absences. Your clinical rotations will occur at the Dental Clinic on campus and three rotational sites.

Some questions you should ask yourself include:

- Do I have dependable transportation?
- Do I have enough money to cover my gas expense to get to and from clinical?
- Will my employer be flexible with my clinical education schedule?
- How reliable is your support structure outside of school?
- What alternatives do you have for unexpected personal schedule changes?
- There may be times when you will miss a clinical rotation because of illness, but if you miss too much time you may be required to make that time up, repeat the course, or you may be released from the program.

Student Health:

After admission to the Dental Hygiene Program, the following are required by our on-campus clinic and the rotation clinical sites and copies of immunization records must show:

- **Measles, Mumps and Rubella (MMR):** Series of 2 vaccines requires or must have a positive antibody titer to demonstrate immunity.
- **TB:** QuantiFERON Gold Blood Test.
- **Hepatitis B:** Requires a series of 3 vaccines, with a subsequent titer to document immunity and signed Declination form if titer shows negative immunity.
- **Varicella (Chicken Pox):** Positive varicella antibody titer of 2 doses of vaccine required, we can no longer accept documented history of chicken pox.
- **Tdap** (Tetanus, Diphtheria, and Pertussis): Required to be within the last 8 Years.

Also Required:

- Current Health and History Exam: This exam should be administered by a qualified health care professional and reflect the student's competence in all areas of our Technical Performance standards (Located in the Dental Hygiene Program Student Handbook).
- Background check and Drug screen through Advantage Students.
- Current Healthcare Provider CPR certification from the American Heart Association/Red Cross (BLS Provider). All accepted students will attend a CPR class during Mandatory Orientation during July before Fall semester begins.
- Malpractice insurance coverage (paid for in tuition/fees).

Associate Degree Course Sequence (86 Semester Hours)

General core education classes required are: ENGL 1101 Composition and Rhetoric; SPCH 1101 Public Speaking; PSYC 1101 Introduction to Psychology; SOCI 1101 Introduction to Sociology; and FSSE 1000 First Semester Seminar.

Also required one from the following: ARTS 1101 Art Appreciation, MUSIC 1100 Music Appreciation, HUMN 1101 Introduction to Humanities, ENGL 2130 American Literature, ENGL 2310 English Literature I, or ENGL 2110 World Literature. (Total general education semester hours = 18)

It is highly recommended that the general education courses be completed prior to entering the program.
