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Section I.

This agreement articulates the acceptance of credit fulfilling the requirements of Brenau University's BBA Healthcare Management Degree from Athens Technical College's Health Information Management Technology Degree, HI13.

Section II.

The tables in section V, along with appendix A (if applicable), detail the courses that Brenau University will accept as transfer credit, and how the transferring institution's respective coursework, corresponds to Brenau University's degree program requirements. Other college courses taken at a degree-granting higher education institution with institutional accreditation by a US Department of Education recognized accrediting body may also be presented on a case-by-case basis for evaluation as transfer credit to Brenau University. This list is not all-inclusive and should be reviewed and updated periodically by the registrars of both institutions participating in this agreement to reflect changes in the curriculum at either institution. The agreement will remain in effect until the vice presidents of Academic Affairs at either institution gives notice that the agreement should be discontinued at the end of the semester in which such notice is communicated in writing. Should this occur, students currently in the program would still be able to complete their program.

Section III.

A grade of "C" or better is required for transfer. Transfer credit is awarded for courses taken at institutionally accredited institutions and cannot be awarded based on placement tests or non-class credit awarded at other institutions.

Financial aid recipients cannot receive aid for courses repeated unnecessarily or for courses not specifically required for their degree.

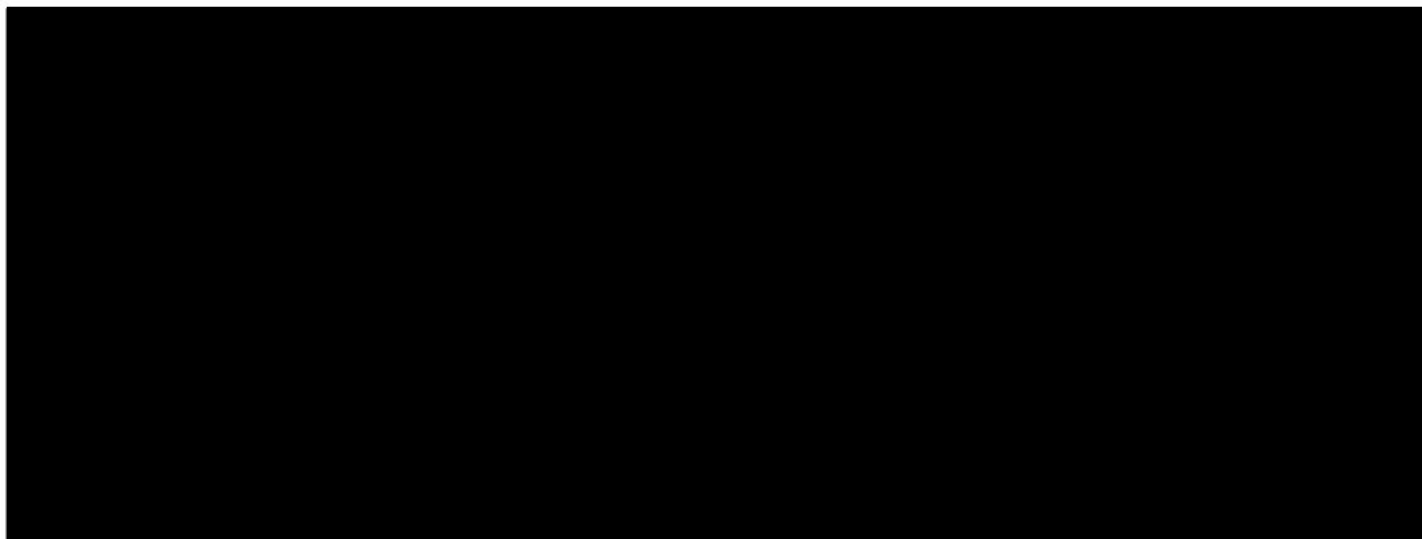
